2. BIBLE TIME

READ:

• John 14:1-13

MAIN POINT:

We use the word miracle for many different reasons. We talk about miracle food, miracle drugs, and miracle computers. Every time a baby is born people say that is a miracle, but what does the Bible mean when it says "miracle?" A miracle is when God changes the normal course of nature. A miracle is a supernatural event.

DISCUSS:

- Do miracles still happen today? Jesus said that we would do the works that He did.
- We don't have a junior Holy Spirit. We have the same Holy Spirit that Jesus had. We cannot make miracles happen, only God can: however, we can pray and ask God to pour out the Holy Spirit on all people (Acts 2:17) and that includes the gift of miracles.

QUESTIONS TO ASK:

- 1. What is a miracle? (when God changes the normal course of nature)
- 2. How can you tell if something is a miracle? (is it something that occurs naturally birth of baby, or what normally happens changes Jesus feed 5000 from 5 loaves and 2 fish)

3. FAMILY TIME

MEAL TIME!

MAIN POINT:

A miracle is when God changes the normal course of nature.

WHAT YOU NEED:

Dinner

WHAT YOU DO:

- If your children are old enough they could actually help you make dinner.
- Talk about how you choose the vegetables and how long you cook the meat for.

DISCUSS

- Talk about two times that miracles were performed.
- John 6:1-14-Jesus feeds 5000
- Exodus 16-manna

- Take time to talk out details in both stories.
- These are both examples of miracles because it is not natural for manna to rain from heaven or to feed so many people from so little.
