

Jesus Rose From The Dead

MEMORY VERSE: BOTTOM LINE: Luke 24:6, "He isn't here! He has risen from the dead..." (NLT) Jesus Rose From The Dead

TO THE TEACHER:

There are three arguments against the resurrection:

- 1. The "Fainting Arugument."
- The "Body Snatchers Argument."
- The "Thief Factor."

There are many religions in the world and they were all started by a person, however Christianity was started by Jesus Christ the Son of the living God. How do we know that the other religions are not true? The founders of all the other religions are all dead, but Jesus Christ rose from the dead. Jesus Christ is still alive.

One of the core beliefs of Christianity is that Jesus Christ has risen from the dead. According to Romans 10:9, believing in the resurrection of Jesus is what causes us to get saved, so how do we know that His resurrection really happened?

We know from secular and Biblical history that Jesus lived about 2,000 years ago. Jesus ministered for three years, was arrested and crucified by the Romans. Almost everyone agrees with these facts. Christians, however, believe that not only did Jesus die on the cross, but that He rose from the dead. If Jesus did rise from the dead, then it proves that He is the Son of God.

Here are some of the arguments against the resurrection:

 The "Fainting Argument" – Some people say that Jesus didn't actually die on the cross, He just fainted.



When the Romans put Him in the tomb, He woke up and His disciples thought He had risen from the dead. This is a pretty silly argument when you stop and think about it. How could Jesus wake up after hanging on a cross for six hours, roll away a heavy tombstone and knock out the Roman guards all by Himself?

- 2. The "Body Snatchers Argument" Other people have argued that someone stole His body and the disciples thought He had risen when they saw the empty tomb. Let's imagine that the Romans or the Pharisees stole His body so that people would not come and worship at the tomb. When the disciples began to preach Christ, the Romans and The Pharisees felt threatened by the growth of Christianity. If they had the body of Jesus, all they would have had to do was parade it down the street, and Christianity would have died. They never produced the body of Jesus, because they did not have His body.
- 3. The "Thief Factor" A third argument is that the disciples stole his body and pretended that Jesus rose from the dead so they could start a new religion. This argument doesn't make much sense either. How would a group of fishermen knock out the Roman Army that was guarding the tomb of Jesus? Also, most of the disciples were put to death for preaching the resurrection of Jesus. Why would they all go to their death to protect a religion that they knew was a lie?



TAKE HOME POINT:	Jesus is not dead, He is alive.
WHAT YOU NEED:	• 3 grave stones (1 with Buddah's name, 1 with Mohammed's name and 1 with Joseph Smith's name)

OBJECT LESSON APPLICATION:

(Hold up tombstone.)

Does anyone know what this is? Right. It is a tombstone. Well, sort of. I made this.

But what are tombstones made for? They are made to mark a grave. Usually you put the person's name on it, the years that they lived, and then maybe some other sentiment that the family may want to remind them of the person buried.

There are many different religions in the world today and all of them had someone who started that religion.

How do you know which religion is true? Well, sometimes you have to check things out.

Buddhism: Founder, Siddharta Gautama, Founded: 320 BC

Mormonism: Founder, Joseph Smith, Founded: 1830 AD

Islam: Founder, Muhammad, Founded: 622 AD

Grave Stones Object Lesson — Continued

Are any of these men still alive?

No! All of these men and leaders are dead and gone. (Hold up grave stones.)

Jesus' hands and feet were pierced with nails and a spear was jabbed into his side. He was wrapped in bandages and laid in a tomb that was sealed shut with a huge stone and guards stood watch.

He did not faint, get out of the bandages, roll back the stone, knock out the guards and begin to walk around having just been beaten and crucified.

No one stole His body. Pilate and the government did not, because what better way to stop the disciples from preaching that Jesus was alive than to produce his dead body. The disciples did not steal his body, because eleven of the twelve were put to death for preaching His resurrection.

Jesus died, rose again, and lives today.

What makes Christianity different from other religions?

SHORT FILM

APPLICATION:

Jesus Christ arose from the dead. You can go to the tomb of Jesus and it is empty. No other religion makes this claim.

The resurrection of Jesus is the core belief of Christianity. According to Romans 10: 9-10, if you believe that Jesus has risen from the dead and confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord, you will be saved.

It was empty because Jesus had risen from the dead and He wasn't there anymore. Jesus had died, but He rose again. He was alive. He was not dead and in the tomb, because He was alive.
